A practicum course (Communication Studies - CMNS 451) has been organized for CFB Wainwright, Alberta, which provides journalists with experience in simulated conflict zones. Three weeks of war games in typical Afghani villages provide the setting. Cameras, recording equipment, jeeps, drivers, and a professional television studio provide the means. Two experienced war correspondents mentor you for the entire exercise.

This practicum offers an unequaled opportunity to prepare for work in conflict zones. But we can only accept 10 participants. In order to qualify, students must submit

• a letter from a doctor verifying physical fitness

Students with at least three years professional experience are preferred. Qualified applicants will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.
